



Gift Aid Declaration for donors who are UK taxpayers

If you accompany your cheque with a signed Gift Aid form, the tax authorities will supplement your gift(s), so the charity gets an extra 28%. If a higher rate taxpayer, you yourself will get a tax refund of 25% (these percentages are subject to change in future years).

1. You can cancel this declaration at any time by notifying the charity.
2. You must pay an amount of Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax at least equal to the tax that the charity reclaims on your donations in the appropriate tax year.
3. If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax equal to the tax that the charity reclaims, you can cancel your declaration.
4. If you are unsure whether your donations qualify for Gift Aid Tax relief, ask the charity, or ask your local tax office for leaflet IR65
5. Please notify the charity if you change your name or address.
